SUBMISSION OF MANIFEST OF VESSELS/SHIPS
FROM FOREIGN

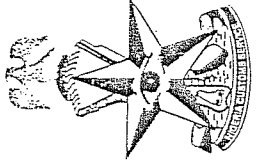
The Service has found it necessary to remind all Shipping Companies on the proper procedures for submission of manifests to facilitate clearance of goods.

2. All shipping companies must submit manifests electronically to the Area commands at least 72 hours before the arrival of the vessel from foreign.
3. Furthermore, hard copies of the manifest personally endorsed by the Captain of the ship are to be submitted to the relevant Customs Area Controller not later than 24 hours after arrival of the ship.
4. Ensure strict compliance, please.

FORFEITURE OF GOODS TO GOVERNMENT AFTER THE EXPIRATION OF THE TWENTY-EIGHT (28) DAYS DWELL TIME OF CARGO AT THE PORTS

It is hereby brought to the notice of the general public that in accordance with the provisions of the relevant sections of the Customs & Excise Notices, the Service shall henceforth abide strictly by the mandatory dwell time of 28 days after which the cargoes will be gazetted as overtime.

The cargoes so listed will subsequently be forfeited to the Federal Government of Nigeria and disposed of accordingly at the expiration of the mandatory thirty (30) days from the date the gazette was published. For the avoidance of doubt, importers have no further legal claims to such cargoes at the expiration of this date.

All Area Controllers/Heads of Units are to please ensure very strict compliance with this directive and give it the widest publicity.
